


Arabic Alphabets

Quick Facts


- The Arabic alphabet, called al-abjadiyah, has 28 letters.
- All 28 letters are consonants, and most letters have four different forms.
- Vowels do not officially exist in Arabic. There are long and short vowel sounds.
- It's a phonetic language that follows very consistent pronunciation rules.
- Arabic is written and read from right to left.
- Arabic letters are made up of a series of strokes and written in a cursive style
- Arabic letters change shape, depending on their placement in a word
- Arabic characters make up the written alphabet for a bunch of different languages, including Persian, Malayalam, Urdu, Central Kurdish, Pashto, and Uyghur.
- Arabic is sometimes nicknamed the language of Daaad.




